The overhead crane has been made to be utilizing performing repetitive lifting activities. This particular type of crane could be utilized in many capacities. They may be utilized for specialized hoisting jobs such as installing or removing major plant machinery.

To safely utilize an overhead crane, staff must employ safe rigging practices. This needs both practice and knowledge. The load should be rigged properly to be able to ensure its stability when raised. Before beginning a hoisting task, it must be determined that the crane is suitable for the job, with right capacity, travel and lift. The crane should be subjected to a thorough visual and physical inspection before utilization. The capacity of all equipment, including the rope, slings and hardware, should never go over load weight capacities.

The rigger needs to know the correct sling for each and every lift and check slings and other rigging hardware prior to using. Clear signals have to be utilized in communications with the crane operator. A signaler should be chosen for the role and signals must be agreed upon. The crane operator must follow instructions just from the designated individual. If a wired or remote controller is being used, the operator should be trained in all its functions.

Prior to whichever lifting starts, the path of the load should be cleared of all hazards and a warning sign must be issued to be able to guarantee the safety of the staff. Pedestrian are not under any circumstance allowed to walk under the lift loads. The crane hoist needs to be centered over the load prior to lifting to prevent swinging. The safety catch should be closed instantly after sliding the sling entirely onto the lifting hook. Sling legs that are not used must be secured so they do not drag. Never leave loose materials on a load being hoisted. Watch that hands and fingers are clear when slack is taken out of a sling. Before the lift is carried out, step clear of the danger zone.
